

Dakshin Kamrup College Women's Forum- at a Glance

Its Birth:

It was in the month of January 2009, that Dr. Nilufar Islam and Dr. Namita Sharma attended a residential SAM (Sensitivity, Awareness and Motivation) workship organized by the Women's' Forum of Cotton College, Guwahati. This workshop of five days turned out to be an eye opener for us. We realised the importance of sensitizing, creating an awareness and motivating women in all spheres of life, touching all sections of society. We opened our Women's Forum in our College on 20th Feb 2009 with encouragement and support from our Principal, Dr. Ramesh Ch. Kalita. Thus the Women's Forum was formulated, aiming at reuniting all the female employees of the College, inclusive of the Teaching and Non-Teaching staff in general and the girl students of the College in particular. Although in its nascent stage, we have organized several talks/workshops/seminars; for it is only with our collective effort that we can hope to bring about change in the lives of women.

Mission:

The mission of the Women's Forum is to encourage all round development of women and to make them aware of health issues, societal know how and also attempt at making women self dependent economically, besides exchanging ideas and influencing socio-economic environment within and outside the college campus. To achieve this goal the mission is illustrated by the following objectives-

- To raise the confidence level and courage amongst the female students because they would be the future guardians of the society.
- Provide encouragement and support for the development of leadership qualities amongst the women community.
- Collaborate with the public for promotion of women's rights and recognition of their achievements.
- To hold meetings amongst all the members for sharing of information and ideas.
- Creating network with the society and involve people of the college periphery and nearby villages in health and other awareness camps.
- Organize seminars on a yearly basis to establish a healthy academic atmosphere in the college.
- To make the students and women employees understand the gravity of harassment in any form, within the college premises, and create awareness about the legal aspects of such issues. As such the Women's Forum of the college has under the directions of the UGC Module on Recognition and Elimination of Sexual Harassment in Higher Educational Institutions has felt the necessity of formulating the Gender Sensitisation Committee Against Sexual Harassment (GSCASH).



A Journey from 2009:

After the inception of this forum in Feb' 2009, our first activity was a Lecture Programme organized on 14th September 2009. The topic of the programme was "Life and Livelihood: Women of Assam at Present- Opportunities & Challenges". The lecture was delivered by Dr. Archana Sarma, HOD, Department of Economics, Gauhati University and also the Director of Women Studies and Research Center G.U. She highlighted the lecture on the challenges faced by women in day to day life as well as in the impact of globalization.




In the same year on 17-12-2009 a health related lecture programme was organized under the topic "Awareness on Women's Health". To create awareness on breast cancer, Resource person Dr. Jayantimala Chakraborty delivered an interesting lecture supported by a slide show. The girl students, teachers, women employees and women from the locality were also present in that programme.

In 2010, we organized an informative talk on 'Sexual Harassment' with Mrs. Sakira Sahin.

A UGC sponsored five days Sensitivity/ Awareness/Motivation Workshop on Capacity Building of Women Managers in Higher Education was held in





search Center G.U. and Anita Tamuli, Dept. of Linguistic, G.U. The workshop was a great success. Various participants from different colleges of Assam participated in the workshop. The Co-ordinator of this Workshop was Gargee Chakravorty, Department of English.

On 24th December 2011 a lecture programme on "Women's Personal 'Scriene and Awareness on AIDS was held. The lecture as delivered by Dr. Subhasmita Barthakur, Gynaecologist of Guwahati Medical College. Teachers, girl students, invitees from outside attended the lecture and took part in the interaction session of the lecture.





On 7th May 2012, the Women's Forum of D.K. College organized a meeting at Gorgora village near Mirza, which is an adopted village of D.K. College under the banner of "Women's Welfare Programme". A street play was also staged by the students of D.K. College to bring awareness among people regarding education, family planning and the ill-effects of some exist-

ing anti-social activities. The play was written and directed by Dr. Deepalee Das, Department of Zoology, D.K. College.





In the same year Women's Forum decided to donate to 'Karunadhara' a Non Governmental Organization (NGO) of Assam, which helps disabled and weak persons of society. The forum has decided to donate annually to this organization.

"Women's Rights: Its Merits and Demerits" - under this topic a successful lecture programme was also organized by Women's Forum on 12.01.2013. Dr. Ruma Bordoloi, Principal, N.E.F. Law College and Ms. Niva Sarma Thakuria, Advocate, Gauhati High Court delivered lectures on various issues related to women's rights. Both the lectures were very informative and thought provoking.

U.G.C. Sponsored two days National Seminer was successfully held on 31st March and 1st April 2013. More than 80 participants had joined the seminar from various colleges within and outside Assam. The main topic of the seminar was "Women & Environment– A look into the issues, problems





& opportunities". Key note address was given by Dr. Upasana Bora Sinha, Associate Professor of Nagaland University. The Seminar was co-ordinated by Dr. Deepalee Das, Department of Zoology.



The members of the Forum have, from its .inception, actively participated in different programmes held at various places in Assam from time to time.

The Future:

Although we are a young organisation, we have received a lot of support from all the members who are very cooperative in all aspects and at the same time enthusiastic in achieving the primary goal i.e. the upliftment of women.

To make the women folk self dependent, the Women's Forum of D.K.College, Mirza, has plans to introduce programmes for self employment through training programmes on Food & Nutrition, handicrafts, fitness programmes (beauty therapies, organising yoga camp) and so on. Besides, the Women's Forum is also interested in involving the local industries for imparting training on cottage industry products. Other vocational training is also in the agenda. Plans for introducing income generating schemes have also been thought about.

For maintaining a healthy academic environment in the college and as a fund generating source, the teachers also have plans for undertaking certain Major and Minor Research Projects on women related issues with emphasis on attaining financial independence. Translation work may also be undertaken. Donation to "Karunadhara" will continue even in the future.

Along with fulfilling these aims and aspirations, we as an organisation also have plans to spensor a female student from an economically backward family every year on the basis of merit.



SOME WOMEN WHO INSPIRE US



Indira Gandhi

Indira Priyadarshini Gandhi (19 November 1917 – 31 October 1984) was the third Prime Minister of India and a central figure of the Indian National Congress party. Gandhi, who served from 1966 to 1977 and then again from 1980 until her assassination in 1984, is the second-longest-serving Prime Minister of India and the only woman to hold the office.

Indira Gandhi was the only child of Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru. As Prime Minister, Gandhi became known for her political ruthlessness and unprecedented centralisation of power.

(June 1915—17 December 2002) is the first film actress of Assamese cinema. She starred in the film, Jyoti Prasad Agarwala's Joymoti (1935). She remained unmarried because she called her co-actor Bongohordeo (husband) in the film. Aideu Handique was born in 1915 in Pani Dihingiya, Golaghat, Assam to Nilambar Handique and Laxmi Handique. Ostracism remained Aideu's lot. Like Joymoti, she was shunned by neighbours, and sank into solitude and obscurity. Villagers would not drink from the pond from which she fetched water, her family were fined by a kangaroo court and no man would marry her.

Indira Miri is a well-known educationist. She had worked all her life for spreading education in Assam and other parts of NE region. On May 16, 2013, The Asamiya Sahitya Sanmilani has appealed to the Government to christen the proposed women's university after the name of Indira Miri.

Indira Goswami, known by her pen name Mamoni Raisom Goswami and popularly as Mamoni Baideo, was an Assamese poet, professor, scholar and writer. She was the winner of the Sahitya Akademi Award (1983),[4] the Jnanpith Award (2001) and Principal Prince Claus Laureate (2008)[6] A celebrated writer of contemporary Indian literature, many of her works have been translated into English from her native Assamese which include The Moth Eaten Howdah of the Tusker, Pages Stained With Blood and The Man from Chinnamasta.




Mary Kom

Mangte Chungneijang Mary Kom, (born 1 March 1983), also known as MC Mary Kom, Magnificent Mary or simply Mary Kom, is an Indian boxer belonging to Kom tribal community of north-eastern state of Manipur. She is a five-time World Boxing champion, and the only woman boxer to have won a medal in each one of the six world championships. She is the only Indian woman boxer to have qualified for the 2012 Summer Olympics, competing in the flyweight (51 kg) category and winning the bronze medal
